### Location of Centres

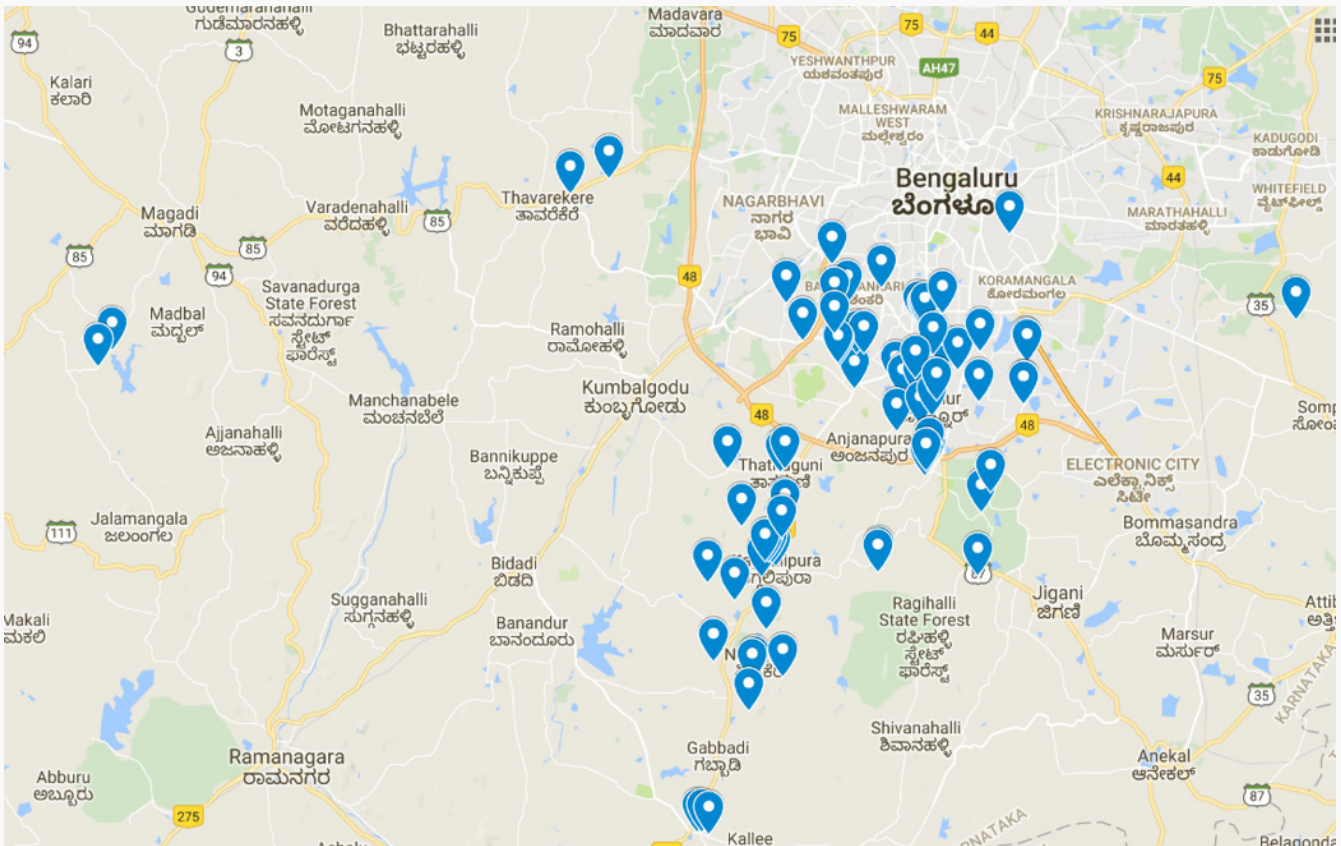
Abhyudaya has a total of 83 centres located throughout Bengaluru South.

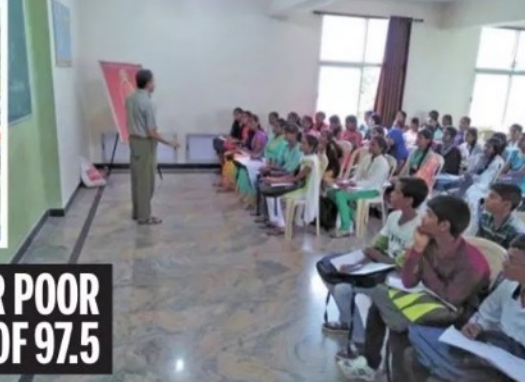

While students of class X in the city have already started their revision exercises with their tutors to prepare for the board exams due next year, several in the slums are taking to enrolling in a coaching centre where teachers of over 30 years of experience take turns to teach the underprivileged for free. In its fourth year of running, the coaching classes have a pass percentage of 97.5. “We just pay the teachers for the transport. They work

on a nominal fee,” says Laxminarayana Damodar, organiser of Jnanagiri coaching classes hosted by Abhyudaya in Konanakunte. The coaching begins in November and runs until February. “As most of the students lack basics, we have classes over the weekends to cover basics from July through October,” says Vidyashankar, one of the teachers at the institute who teaches Maths. The visiting faculty of PESIT teaches advanced mathematics to MBA students. During the May-June period, the teachers also help students

to clear their supplementary exams. The initiative also funds up to 70% college education of deserving underprivileged students. The coaching classes have a limited seating of 280 students and teaches students every subject part of the Class X curriculum both in English and Kannada medium. “This year, we have received applications from around 300 students, but we will be accepting only 280, because we don’t have space to host 300 students,” says Laxminarayana. Teachers from several schools including St

Joseph’s School finish their morning classes and rush to Jnanagiri to coach the students 4.30 pm to 6 pm on weekdays. On Saturdays and Sundays, there two classes each on different subjects. “Since the teachers and students come directly from their classes to the coaching session, we usually offer snacks such as badam milk and biscuits,” says Laxminarayana, who started this initiative in 2013. Realising that there aren’t many government schools back them in Konanakunte, he set up the coaching classes

for those preparing for their Class X exams, while living in the slums. “Today we have several government schools, so the students get training from both ends,” he says, adding that, “The teachers almost work for free. We usually pay for the transport and offer snacks.” The students are coached for 110 days. “Last year, from the 280 students part of the coaching classes, 156 SSLC students scored distinction and 80 kids scored over 95%,” says a proud Laxminarayana. This year, the classes will start from November 1.

### Motivational talk for girl students

BENGALURU Deputy Conservator of Forest, Bengaluru, Dipika Bajpai on Sunday impressed upon girl students the importance of reading newspapers as part of the preparations for the civil services examinations. Interacting with students of Abhyudaya Teaching Centre at Konanakunte, which organises a 110-day tuition for children from economically weaker sections for the SSLC examinations, she urged them to focus on good education, which would help them get a good job, besides helping them to be financially independent. According to a release, she said that a woman may decide not to work, but she should be capable of getting a job any time and supporting her family, and strive towards excellence in all spheres of life. Abhyudaya Teaching Centre organises motivational speech by experts on Sundays to motivate SSLC students to focus on academics.

## Cabbie’s daughter wants to crack IAS

Bengaluru: Nidhi M, a cab driver’s daughter, scored 96.8% with centums in English and science. After regular school hours at Carmel School, she would be at the Jnanagiri centre of Abhyudaya, near Konanakunte, between 4.30pm and 6.30pm. It’s one of the 82 centres across the city. “My dream is to be an IAS officer,” she told TOI. “My daughter has made us very happy; I hadn’t expected her to score so well,” said her father Manjunath S, a cab driver and resident of Jaranahalli. Abhyudaya is a not-for-profit organisation which conducts evening classes for students from a poor socio-economic background. As many as 13 students trained by it have scored well, with

results ranging from first class to 98.8%. Varshita A, another student trained by Abhyudaya, scored 96.16% with her highest being 99 in Kannada. She had a tough time during her exam when her mother fell sick. “Despite having to help my ill mother, I managed to score well. I want to become

an engineer,” she adds. Her father, a technician in a private firm, took a loan and bought her a laptop to help in her studies. Sudeep R, another Abhyudaya student, scored 88.37%. “Communing to the centre after school every day was difficult. I struggled with the hardship but am now seeing

a rainbow after the rain,” he said. He studied at YAS National High School in Subramanyapura and his father is a tailor. Abhubakkar Nadaf, the son of a security guard (father) and tailor (mother), scored 77.76%. “When I heard about Abhyudaya providing free classes, I approached them and joined them for 110 days. My parents supported me a lot despite financial constraints,” said Nadaf. “When Abhyudaya started in 2004, it operated from a single centre with 12 students. Our teachers are all volunteers and some are college students,” said Vidyashankar T R, member of the advisory board. They teach children from classes 3 to 10 for two hours every day. — Harshita Saraf and Shrividya Somanna

### Govt servants, teachers aid poor students with finance & tuitions

Laxminarayana has been working at the KPFCCL for many years. However along with his daily duties at his job, he and a group of working professionals and retirees run a centre called the Abhyudaya that has been working for several years to uplift children from economically weaker backgrounds, by providing free scholarships at the college level and free tuitions at the school level. On Sunday, the group organised Aarohan, various competitions for students from slums and villages in and around South Bangalore. As many as 1600 children participated in the competition that included 300 volunteers and judges such as actor Jaggaiah. Science exhibition was one of the main attractions of the event. A child made a model of the solar system, another made a rocket, a student from Hommasandra government school made a model of forest with the city on the outskirts. There were also essay competition, drawing and public speaking contest to name a few. Laxminarayana, says, “Such events give these deprived children an opportunity to exhibit their talents. Once the talent of a child gets recognised there is no end to what he or she is capable of. That child will keep participating in several programmes at different places. This is a way for them to build confidence and do great things in whatever endeavour they choose.” With the help of Abhyudaya many children have enrolled in professional courses like engineering, medicine, adds Laxminarayana. The organisation also gives free tuition from class 1 to 9. Anuradha Joshi, a retired banker and a volunteer at Abhyudaya, says, “Everybody need not give everything but if everyone makes even a small contribution, it will bring a lot of positive changes to society at large.” Venka Bharve, a homemaker devotes her time daily at the Kalika Kendra (coaching centre) after completing her work at home. Other volunteers include people like Vidyashankar, a visiting faculty at PES University, Chandrashekar, a finance professional, Bhadrathin, retired education official.

## NGO trains parents to help SSLC students

**Bengaluru:** Raju P, 23, a final-year medical student, never dreamt of becoming a doctor. After falling into bad company, he had taken to peddling drugs and washing cars. He evaded arrest but was picked up four years ago by volunteers of Abhyudaya, an NGO, which, with parental support, put him on the path to rehabilitation.

Raju (name changed) was tutored under the first batch of Jnanagiri, a free coaching programme for SSLC students from economically weaker sections in south Bengaluru. "Becoming a doctor is much more than what I'd ever expected in life," says Raju.

Jnanagiri's approach to the task is holistic: besides coaching students, care is taken to ensure they are protected from any kind of distraction. Parents are counselled, given a charter of 13 dos and don'ts and made to give an undertaking that they will abide by it. Parents commit themselves not to distract children at home by watching TV, not to give them two-wheelers and mobile phones, not burden them with work and attend teachers' meeting regularly.

"The dos and don'ts were listed by our volunteers who had observed during counselling that these were distractions for students," says D Laxminarayan, an electrical engineer and executive team member of Abhyudaya.

Jnanagiri's approach has yielded rich dividends. Three hundred Jnanagiri students took the SSLC exam last year. While 28 scored above 90%, 142 bagged distinction.



**INCLUSIVE MISSION**

Coaching classes are now being conducted at 70 centres in Konanakunte, Puttenahalli, Jambusawari Dinne and Hakki Pikki Colony, off Bannerghatta Road.

"Our students' achievements give us the power to reach out to more who want to study but cannot afford coaching. Most volunteers are top executives but are committed to bringing about social change. Many homemakers living nearby have volunteered to teach after seeing what the students have achieved," said Paneendra Kumar B L, a power system engineer.

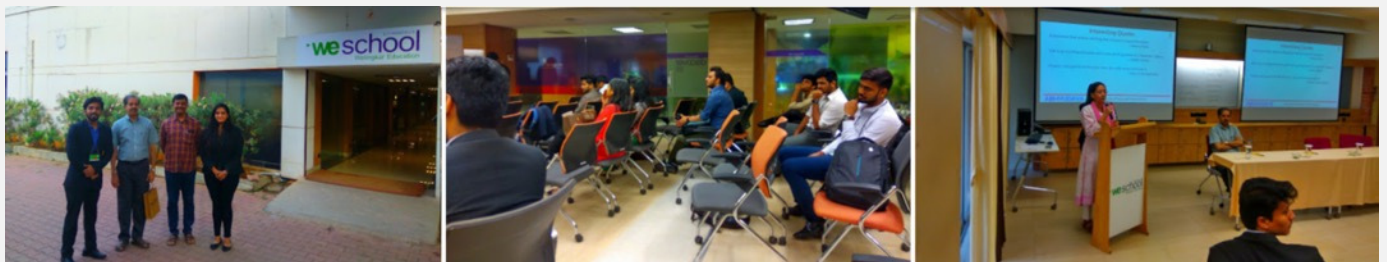
### **Interaction with experts**

Jnanagiri is a free 110-day special coaching programme for SSLC students who are selected after counselling. Most are children of drivers, factory workers, domestic helps and construction workers and a few have been in conflict with law sometime. The classes are held for one-and-a-half hours for five days a week and three hours on Saturday in maths, science and language. On Sundays, scientists, doctors, police/army officers, corporate honchos, executives and academics interact with students.

## Outreach Program at Welingkar institute of management



Team Abhyudaya visited Welingkar Institute of Management Bengaluru. Members addressed the MBA students and shared stories of social transformation by Abhyudaya. This institute being a top MBA college, the students who are future business leaders were made aware of various social problems and its solutions through social transformation. Shri Lakshminarayana and Shri Vidyashankar interacted with the students. They emphasised that through social transformation our country's economy can reach the next level. Dr Smitha Gupta, a faculty in the college spoke to the students about the importance of reaching out to the poor and working for the deprived. She told that working and volunteering for NGO helps the students in their career.





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## Career Counselling



Abhyudaya conducted a career awareness program by noted journalist Sri Nanjundappa Venkatarayappa. He shared an insight with the children about Journalism as a career. He told the children that honesty is very important for this profession.



Career counselling on Accountancy was conducted



Palaniswamy, Senior cameraman of Doordarshan, spoke about our country having few camerawomen and urged the girls to take up this challenge. He asked the parents to encourage the girls to enter unique fields. He opined that there was a lot of scope for sports photographers globally and India has the potential to provide people for this job. Vittal, a video journalist spoke to children and parents about career in photography, event management and content writing.



Faculty from VET Polytechnic, JP Nagar, Anjana, Nalini, Jahan educated the students and parents about various diploma courses. They asked the parents not to shy away from sending their children to diploma as one can also do BE or get a technical job after Diploma



Srinivas from Ashirvad Pipes spoke to children about Plumbing as a career. Plumbing course is very helpful as it creates livelihood and gives quality plumbers to the society. Many apartments, star hotels need qualified plumbers.



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## Arohana a unique competition for socially deprived children



Arohana, a unique competition for socially deprived children was conducted by Abhyudaya. The program was held on 7th Jan 2018 Sunday at Ramakrishna Samagra Shikshana Kendra, Gottigere. Most of the students were from slums and villages in and around Bengaluru South.

1600 children participated in various competitions. More than 300 volunteers and 60 judges were there in the event. The event was covered by Doordarshan Kannada channel.

Event was inaugurated by Prof. Shreedhar Swamy and famous cine artist Sri Jaggesh was the chief guest. Science exhibition was one of the main attractions. Children had prepared models of solar systems, rockets, and one even made a Harley Davidson bike. It was surprising that the children were aware of all these.

A student from Bommasandra government school displayed Protect Forest theme model. He had displayed vehicles and people at the edge of the forest. It showed that these children were well aware of the importance of saving our forests, about the indiscriminate destruction of forests and man-animal conflicts.

Such events provide the deprived children with an opportunity to exhibit their talents. Our experience has shown a very positive impact on the confidence of these children to participate in many more similar programs, especially when they see their talent getting recognised. We have also observed how it encourages many more children, who are otherwise shy, to express their hidden talents.

Mrs Dipika Bajpai, IFS officer, Deputy Conservator of Forest, Bengaluru visited Abhyudaya on Dec 10 2017. She interacted with the children and answered their questions related to their career choices. Many girl students were very inspired by this. The officer expressed her desire to see students from Abhyudaya as IAS, IPS and IFS officers in future.

She also explained to the children the importance of conservation, particularly about tigers. She said that "Protection of one tiger protects several hundred square kilometres of forest and ecology. Entire food chain gets preserved. This is the scientific reason for protecting tigers". She stressed the importance of reading newspapers to students so that they can do well in competitive exams. She told the children that education to a girl is education to the entire society. She emphasised that girls have to be financially independent and asked the them to be focused in life to get good jobs in future.

She told marriage should not be primary objective of girls, it is part of life, but the priority should be financial independence. A woman may decide not to work but she should have the capacity to get a job any time and support her family. She said that "Our duty is to strive towards excellence in all spheres of individual and collective activity, so that the nation constantly rises to higher levels of endeavour and achievement". She asked the children to stay focused and to excel in the field of their choice in the future.

She also stressed about fundamental duties given in our constitution.

Shridar Swamy, a Professor of National College and part of RSS, chief speaker spoke about the growth of Abhyudaya and the people behind this success. 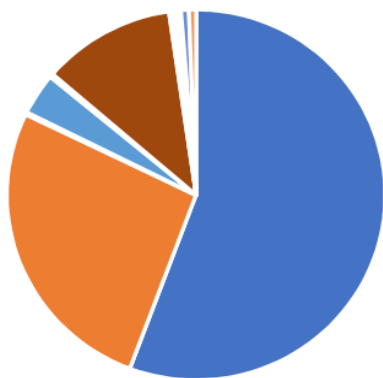

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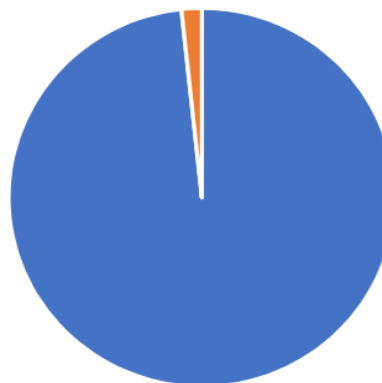
